
2025 6th Grade Summer Reading

In August, students will complete three in-class assignments, each covering one of their summer reading books. Each assignment will count as a test grade and cannot be taken home, so students must complete all required reading during the summer.

The Bad Beginning by Lemony Snicket


Genre: Dark Humor / Adventure / Fiction




The Sign of the Beaver by Elizabeth George Speare




Projekt 1065 by Alan Gratz

Lexile: 780L

Island of the Blue Dolphins by Scott O'Dell

Genre: Historical Fiction / Survival / Adventure

Lexile: 1000L

When her tribe is forced to leave their island, Karana is left behind and must learn to survive completely on her own. Based on a true story, this classic novel tells a powerful tale of courage, self-reliance, and resilience in the face of isolation.

Reading Challenge (Optional):

To challenge students to reach their full reading potential, there is a school-wide reading challenge in which qualifying students will be entered into a back-to-school drawing.

Read a minimum of 800 minutes (choosing books from a teacher-provided list) to be entered into a Back-to-School drawing. Students should log their reading minutes on their reading log, aiming for 20 minutes per day, 5 days per week.

in disguise—bringing more chaos, danger, and unfortunate twists.




Flipped by Wendelin Van Draanen

family, and first impressions.




The Mysterious Benedict Society by Trenton Lee Stewart


Freak the Mighty by Rodman Philbrick

No Summit out of Sight: The True Story of the Youngest Person to Climb the 7 Summits by Jordan Romero



this hilarious and satirical story


Inkheart by Cornelia Funke

richly imagined fantasy celebrating the magic of storytelling.




The Tale of Despereaux by Kate DiCamillo

timelines, photos, and real-world heroism.




Miss Peregrine's Home for Peculiar Children by Ransom Riggs

It feels so good to look forward to summer. After months of hard work, it will be nice to enjoy a more relaxing schedule. I know you have worked hard all year, and I don't want your word skills and creative skills to slip. I encourage you to participate in my summer challenge. My hope is that completing this activity will help you stay sharp with your word skills.

Here is the challenge; complete the lists following these guidelines.

- Unless you have an accommodation plan that allows you to use your computer, the lists must be hand-written.
- 2. Your answers need to come from your own brain. It's not okay to look them up on the computer or ask your family or friends what you should write (although it is okay for your mom or your friend to give you one or two suggestions).
- 3. Start each list on a separate sheet of paper. One list may extend over multiple pages.
- 4. Each time you add to one of your lists, add the date.
- 5. The longer your lists, the more points you earn.
- 6. At the end of your work, add this statement: All of these answers came from my head. I did not use the internet, and I only got a few ideas from my parents or other people. Then sign it.
- 6. Students who do a <u>really good job</u> will be rewarded with a bonus test grade for the first quarter of next year. Everyone who turns in any work will receive a couple of pieces of candy; I'd definitely aim for the test grade.
- 7. Start your lists while it's still May and add to them at least a few times each week. I think working for small chunks of time (5-10 minutes) often throughout the summer is the best strategy to follow.

6. Don't let this become burdensome. Look upon it as a challenge. Can you come up with a combined total of 100 answers? (Sure you can!) Can you get to 300 answers? (I bet you can.) How about 500 answers? (That will get you a good test grade.) Can you come up with 1000 answers? (That might get you bragging rights for your class, but we won't know for sure until we count everyone's responses.) 10,000 answers? (I'm speechless!!)
